1. Transferred - 15, 027 tons of MSW waste delivered (Garbage)
2. Transferred - 980 tons of C & D waste (Demolition)
3. Transferred - 4,823 tons of single stream curbside recycling
4. Shipped- 300 tons of OCC (cardboard)
5. Shipped – 18.5 tons of office paper
6. Shipped – 55.5 tons of scrap metal
7. Shipped – 249 pounds of recycled batteries
8. Shipped - 1, 500 pounds of Holiday Lights

RENVILLE COUNTY LANDFILL

1. Received – 3,250 tons of C&D Waste
2. Received – 980 tons of C&D Waste from the RRRSWA Transfer Facility
3. Shipped – 2 tons of recyclables to the RRRSWA Transfer Facility
4. Shipped - 30 tons of tires to Liberty Tire, St. Martin, MN
5. Shipped – 6 tons of scrap metal to Nelsons Salvage
6. Shipped - 334 pounds of recycled batteries
7. Shipped - 500 gallons of used motor oil to J & J Waste Oil

Renville County Landfill Reporting (State)

1. Compaction rate decreased from 962 lbs./cy (2023) to 932 lbs./cy in 2024.
2. Landfill C&D waste decreased by 341 tons from 3,591(2023) to 3,250 tons in 2024.
3. Landfill life expectancy decreased from 4.5 years (2023) to 2.9 years in 2024.
4. MSW Leachate generation increased by 8,128 gallons from 124,888 (2023) to 133,016 (2024).
5. Minnesota Duty Officer/local fire departments were called in September for a grass fire cause by powerline walking squirrel. No damage was reported to either of the closed MSW or open Demolition Landfill Cells. The squirrel was pronounced dead at the scene.
