### **Maintaining Your System**

## You just had a new septic system installed, now what?

Once a new system is installed, Renville County sends a folder that contains a Certificate of Compliance, the site map, a management plan, and a homeowner's guide. The management plan is specified to your system.


#### Management Plan

Under the management plan, you should find...

- The people that designed and installed your system.
- The Service Provider/Maintainer for future needs.
- Your tank's general info.
- The homeowner's tasks
- The Service Provider's tasks
- A list of common water-using devices in the home and how they impact your system

### **General Maintenance Tips**

- Homeowners should have their septic tank pumped and inspected at least once every 3 years.
  Maintainers may recommend more frequent pumping, depending on usage. New Systems should have a follow-up inspection 6 months after the system is installed to make sure it is operating sufficiently.
- Keep vehicles and other heavy equipment off the septic system,
  which includes the sewer line, to avoid compaction. Compaction reduces the performance of the soil treatment area, can cause freezing, and also could damage the tank itself.



- Maintain vegetative cover over the soil treatment area, i.e. grass, native grasses, or flowers. Do NOT plant trees, shrubs, or deep-rooted plants on or near the soil treatment area.
- Reduce the amount of cleaners and other chemicals that are flushed down the drain. Septic systems rely on bacteria to break down sewage and cleaners can kill off the bacteria.
- Spread out water usage throughout the week, rather than using a lot at one time.
- Water from roof drains, basement drain sump pumps, hot tubs, swimming pools and other clear or chemically treated water should NOT be put into the septic system.
