#### January - March 2020

- Radio interviews
- 2<sup>nd</sup> intern started
- Two presentations to ministerial groups
- Articles in Olivia Register and Renville Sibley Coop
- COVID canceled the first Circle on the 3-16.
  Zooming the following week.





#### April – June 2020

- Addition of 2<sup>nd</sup> family in Tuesday nights Circle
- Zoom support (visitations, meetings)
- Foster Parent Support (FPS) Circle started (monthly)
- Volunteer Check in and Recruiting Circle
- 2<sup>nd</sup> intern completed hours





#### July - Sep. 2020

- Training Circles began Wed @ noon (6 weeks)
- Addition of a Circle on Wednesday night
- Addition of Circle on Wed. @ noon (Sentencing)
- Initial Circles held in person
- Attended a Circle Facilitator training

- Maintain 3-6 virtual Circles a week
- Facilitated 2 Family Group Decision Making Circles with Human Services
- Final Enhanced Rehabilitation Court participant graduation

#### Volunteer Feedback

"It's an amazing program for all of us. I've learned to communicate better with people, been rewarding even in the midst of COVID. Got to go to some classes in the past to build better understanding." "Appreciate the new volunteers coming in. Suggest a notebook for the circle you're in, there are questions you want to ask but then it gets to you, you forget. Life experiences, with such a well rounded group, when you don't think you have something to offer, you do. You might be able to ask something that others can't. It just works! It takes time to grow together, it's going to be a long haul. You will get more out of it then you ever dreamed possible. Been a great year for me and made some great friends from it."



#### Volunteer Feedback

"Going into this I didn't know what it was going to bring. It is crazy when you get your first family, but people start opening up and we feel that human connection. We don't have to be here, we aren't getting paid to be here, but simply are heart felt people who just want to help. It's not just about them but about all of us."



#### Participant Feedback

Volunteer asked: Do you feel when you look back when this all started, do you look at yourself and think I am not the same person emotionally?

- Participant 1: I do, especially getting the trouble out of the way instead of waiting till 19 or 20 and it's was a wakeup call emotionally, I can agree with that.
- Participant 2: I Think I have definitely grown, but I think everyone has grown since this happened. I'm just glad I got my trouble making phase out of the way before I was 18.



#### Participant Feedback

Volunteer complimented a mother stating, "You and Dad have done some incredible parenting."

The mother replied stating, "Thank you it has been a long and rough road. He's grown so much. In the beginning I wasn't sure how it will go. Now I have a great amount of hope and for his future. We are blessed to have him with us and to show him that non all families want to give up. I also believe in my heart that if it wasn't for circle he wouldn't be here either. He has grown so much from being in circle. I can't think God enough for all of you. You guys are the light we needed. I so glad we meet you and the rest of the crew. We Love You All."



#### Participant Feedback FPS Circle

"Just appreciate all the input from everyone, there is a lot of good things that come out that far out way the bad situations that come up. Don't get discouraged if something bad happens, and thankful for the circle." "I'm two hours away and this is very helpful (began to cry). Our stories are so similar"... the next round she was able to put more into words. "This was really beneficial knowing that I am not the only one who is dealing with this. It's a struggle. Just knowing we are not the only ones dealing with this at the same time and having someone to fall back on to talk to. Our social worker and GAL are great but having you guys here to listen to your stories is so beneficial and I know we are not the only ones to wait, say no, and wonder what it going to happen. Thanks for inviting and having me on."



## Feedback from other Professionals
