The nine-member Parks and Trails Committee meets quarterly. One member is appointed by the Renville County Board of Commissioners from each of the five commissioner voting districts with four members selected at-large, two of which are youth members. Members serve three-year terms with a term limit of nine consecutive years. Each Parks and Trails Committee Member is paid a per diem of \$65 per meeting plus compensation for mileage to and from meetings.

The Parks and Trails Committee has the following duties and responsibilities.

- Study, report, and make recommendations on amendments to the Park Ordinance and the Parks and Trails Plain prior to adoption of an amendment by the Renville County Board of Commissioners.
- 2. Conduct public hearings, review all information, and prepare a report and recommendation to the County Board on park land acquisition and development.
- 3. Act as an advisory committee to the County Board reviewing all recreation, leisure, and park-related issues including park planning, operation, maintenance, protection, and improvement and trail related issues including trail planning, development, construction, operation and maintenance, and funding sources.
- 4. Study and recommend appropriate fees for park permits and trail system user fees.
- 5. Such other duties as the Renville County Board of Commissioners may recommend.

Parks Department Staff



The Renville County Parks Department maintains the seven county parks and provides grounds keeping at several of the Public Works buildings, the Government Services Center complex, Renville County Fairgrounds, and the Birch Coulee Battle Field grounds. The Department has two full-time employees. A Park Manager, whose primary duties are performed within the office, but who also provides direction and assistance in the field when needed, and the Lead Maintenance Worker whose duties are performed in the field. There are also three seasonal park maintenance workers that assist the Lead Maintenance worker, generally

between the months of May and August. The Parks Department also received assistance in the Spring and Fall from a Highway employee when help was needed.

With the staffing that the department had in 2021, the primary focus of the maintenance crew from April through October was to maintain the current condition of the parks, which included mowing common areas, cleaning of the shelters, restrooms, horse bunkers, and campsites and other routine maintenance.

While maintaining the parks a few other things parks staff accomplished were:

- Trail directional signage, trail name signage, you are here map signage and park kiosk signage installed in Beaver Falls Recreation Area and in Birch Coulee.
- Trail signage was installed at Vicksburg.
- Assisted with camping reservations.
- Ordered road signage to better direct motorist to the Beaver Falls Horse Camp and Recreational Area.
- Cut, split and supplied wood at parks for campers.
- Re-mulched plants and flower beds in all of the parks.
- · Added more horse ties in Beaver Falls.
- Attended the 2021 MN Horse Expo.
- Attended the Renville County Fair.
- Fixed, stained and numbered picnic tables and benches.
- Helped an Eagle Scout install horse shoe pits at Beaver Falls and Skalbekken.
- Cut trees along park roads and trails.
- Installed new bathroom doors at Skalbekken.

- Made trail improvements in wet areas at Beaver Falls.
- Repaired and refurbished trash cans.
- Attended multiple organized horse hides at Beaver Falls with different originations.
- Had a snow plow route with the Highway Department.

Contracted Work

- Groomed winter trails at Beaver Falls and Skalbekken.
- Road work in Beaver Falls at the hairpin

Saddle Club Volunteer Hours

 Between six different Saddle Clubs, members volunteered 229.25 hours to keep up and improve Renville County's Horse Camps and Trails.

Grants

• Minnesota Trail Riders Association - \$5,000 to replace steel doors on restroom facilities at both Beaver Falls and Skalbekken horse camps.

2021 Park Usage

The Renville County Parks Department tracked camping usage within the park system via camping permits. Camping fees for rustic camping is the same in all parks, but different parks with electric and or water had different rates.

The rates for 2021 are shown below:
