SITUATIONAL UPDATE: LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES OPENING UP OUTDOOR VISITS TO ADDRESS SENIORS IN ISOLATION

WHILE THE GENERAL PUBLIC IS IN PHASE THREE OF THE STAY SAFE MN PLAN, LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES ARE NOT ABLE TO MOVE OUT OF PHASE ZERO IN ORDER TO KEEP RESIDENTS SAFE.







Long-term care facilities, including nursing homes, assisted livings, and other congregate settings, have been the hardest hit by Minnesota's coronavirus outbreak.

The majority of COVID-19 related fatalities in Minnesota have been in older adults who live in long-term care facilities.

WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT AT OUTDOOR AND OPEN WINDOW VISITS:

- Call Ahead for Appointment
- Visit During Visitation Hours
- Be Screened for Signs and Symptoms of COVID-19
- Sign in Upon Arrival
- Stay in Designated Visitor Location
- Wear a Mask
- Use Hand Sanitizer Before and After Visit
- Stay Outside
- Sit Six Feet Apart
- · Bring a Pet
- Give Air High Fives or Air Hugs (*Please no physical hugs, hand holding, or kisses*)
